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Expenditure July 2021

One goal mentoring occurred across the year, despite the local and national lockdowns. Targeted children received personal coaching aimed at promoting positive mental health and resilience. This was particularly important during this academic year. Pupil score cards show an improvement in all measured areas for all children.

Specialist PE tuition using outside providers in cricket, multi skills and dance were provided in the Autumn and Summer terms. Due to national lockdown the school did not use outside PE providers in the spring term.

Additional workshops were provided regarding anti racism in sport, due to the black lives matter movement, increasing pupils awareness of racism on sport (Y5 and Y6)

Bright leaders have also been employed to develop pupil leadership skills, with the intention of developing playground sports leaders – this will continue to 2021-22. The deposit has been paid and the remaining costs have been allocated, and will officially be reconciled in the next financial year, but money has been approved this year.

A booking has also been reserved for 21-22 at the Anderton Centre for extended curriculum outdoor adventure activities next year. The remaining costs will appear in the 21-22 plan.

Kearsley West £ 700 Inter school competitions took place in the autumn term 2020, but were then suspended due to lockdown. They will resume in September 2021. At this point we introduced a weekly fitness challenge on the school blog and promoted through the fitness@stpeters twitter account.

Sports day certificates and medals, and weekly fitness certificates £55. These were used to incentivise the competitive sports and participation in weekly inter class fitness competitions, resulting in greater participation in fitness activity across the year, with increasing numbers of pupils participating each week (see fitness twitter account and blog)
